We will be returning to Uganda on June 5th. Richard, Nelson, my mother and I will be traveling together. One reason I have stayed in the states is to help with my mother's illnesses. She has improved a great deal the past year and is now able to travel with us. She has been healed from diabetes and has not had seizures in five months.

Baltimore Baptist Church donated \$6500.00 for Filling His Nets to dig a well. This will be the sixth well (borehole) dug since 2001. Water is very precious in Uganda. We stand at our bathroom sink, here in America, brushing our teeth and let the water run but in Uganda they do not have the luxury of letting the water run.

The school building at Trace Creek Baptist Mission will be finished while we are in Uganda. This will give an additional 8 classrooms for the school.

Embracing the Children needs additional sponsors. I know that you have not received report cards or newer pictures of your sponsored child but I personally will be taking the pictures and getting updates on each of your children. When we return from Uganda, I will be sending them out to you sometime in July.

In Africa, 3,000 people die each day from malaria. We will be purchasing more mosquito nets. Mosquito nets literally can save lives. For \$10.00 you can purchase a mosquito net for a family and help save a precious life.

We will begin digging footer for our personal house while we are there. We have been in Uganda since 2001 and have paid rent at an average of \$425.00 per month. The housing is getting hard to find. Rent has increased. And soon we will be probably asked to pay \$700-800 per month because a new dam is being built. Germans, Italians and Swedes are willing to pay that price and higher for a "Muzungu" house. A muzungu house is one that has been rented by whites and have added amenities to it, i.e. more electrical sockets, washer/dryer hook-ups, generator ready, new paint and of course we take very good care of the houses we rent. We received our federal income tax last year and bought some land up on the Nile River where land was available.

Heart To Hand Thrift Store is doing well. We have Christian personnel who will be handling the store while we are gone. Lisa Hayes will be doing the administrative duties. Tina Feezor will be managing the back room controlling the donations received; Alice Marqueza and Nancy Rambo will be helping with sales and receiving donations as they come in.

As you can see that there is still so much to do. Seeds have been planted and Filling His Nets is watering those seeds. We continue to ask for your prayers and your financial support. We have seen what God is doing. Not just once. Not even twice, but time after time he has shown Himself faithful in this ministry we share in Uganda.
